

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LENSES FOR PORTRAITS AND GROUPS.

Imported expressly for . Thos. H. McCollin.

No. 1. 4 size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 1 9-16 and 1 5-8 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 143 Mm., (back-focus 4 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movement, and central stops; adapted for taking-pictures on plates 4 1-4 x 3 1-4 inches. Can be had in matched pairs. Good for taking small pictures up to Cartes de Visite, where the gallery does not allow the use of a larger lens. The necessary length of studio for this purpose is about 12 feet. \$34 00

A ½ size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic combinations of Lenses, 1 5-6 and 1 11-12 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 167 Mm., (back-focus 4 1-2 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movement, and central

No. 2. ½-size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 2 1-8 and 2 3-16 inch diam. Equivalent focus 191 Mm., (back-focus 5 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movement, and central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 5 1-2 x 4 1-4 inches; can be had in matched pairs. These are excellent for Cartes de Visite, when your studio will not admit of a larger size; also, good-for making Stereoscopic heads; but we recommend the 2-3 size, No. C or D, which will be found still better. Length of studio for Cartes de Visite, about 18 feet, \$52 50

B. ½ size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 2 1-8 and 2 3-16 inch diam. Equivalent focus 167 Mm., (back-focus 4 1-2 inches). Completely mounted with rack and pinion movement and central stops. Adapted for pictures on plates 5 x 4 inches. Length of studio for Cartes de Visite about 15 feet. \$59 50

This Lens works, on account of its short focus, 1-3 quicker than No. 2, which possesses normal light, and is therefore most useful for taking very plastic likenesses of children and sitting persons, and bust-portraits.

The above-mentioned Lenses, particularly constructed for taking Cartes de Visite pictures in a short studio, cannot be compared with the following lenses regarding the efficience and equal sharpness of the pictures, especially when taking standing figures.

Can be had in matched pairs.

C. $\frac{2}{3}$ size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 2 3-4 and 2 5-6 inch diam. Equivalent focus 238 Mm., (back-focus 7 inches). Completely

mounted, with rack and pinion movement and central stops; adapted for taking pictures on plates 7 1-4 x 5 1-2 inches and smaller. This will be found very desirable for Cartes de Visite, and also for making Stereoscopic heads. Can be had in matched pairs Requisite length of studio for Cartes de Visite, about 20 feet; less distance for bust-portraits \$75 00

D. 3 size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 2 3-4 and 2 5-6 inch diam. Equivalent focus 214 Mm., (back-focus 6 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movement, and central stops. Adapted for making pictures on plates 6 1-2 x 5 inches. \$80 00

What has been said regarding the difference of quality between No. 2 and B, refers also to C and D, as the proportions between length of focus and aperture are the same in both. Can be had in matched pairs. Requisite length of studio for full-length pictures 19 feet; less distance for bust portraits.

This is the most useful Lens that a Photographer can possess for making Cartes de Visite, Cabinets, and 4-4 pictures, when his studio will not admit the use of larger lenses. Requisite length of studio for full-length Cabinet Portraits 18 feet, and for Cartes de Visite 24 feet: less distance for bust-portraits.

3 B. 4-4 size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 3 1-8 and 3 3-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 325 Mm., (back-focus 9 1-2 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movement, and central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 8 x 10 inches and smaller. \$92 50

This Lens being of longer focus than No. 3. does not work quite as quickly, but covers a larger plate, and is fine for groups and Cabinet pictures. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 18 feet, will appear 41-2 inches long on the ground-glass; less distance for bust portraits.

No. 3 A. 4-4 size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 3 1-8 and 3 3-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus, 364 Mm., (back-focus 10 1-2 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movements, and central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 9 x 11 inches and smaller. \$87 50

This Lens will be found excellent for groups as well as other pictures: A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 18 feet, will appear 5 inches long on the ground glass.

4. 4-4 size. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 3 1-8 and 3 3-16 inch diam. Equivalent focus, 214 Mm., (back-focus, 5 1-4 inches). Completely mounted, with rack and pinion movement, and central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 6 1-2 x 5 inches.

On account of its very short focus, this Lens requires only 2-5 of the time of the exposure of Lenses with normal power of light, and is therefore most useful for taking likenesses of children, particularly in dark and cloudy weather. Requisite length of studio, 19 feet; less distance for bust-portraits.

All the following Lenses are without rack and pinion movement, for large Lenses it is more advantageous to have the Camera provided with the focusing arrangement.

5. Ea. 4-4. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 3 3-4 and 3 5-8 inch diam. Equivalent focus 325 Mm., (back-focus 9 1-2 inches) Completely mounted, with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 8 x 10 inches.

This Lens has recently been constructed for making Cabinet pictures or smaller sizes, works quickly and will be found a very excellent instrument for full-length pictures, busts or groups; for full length Cabinet pictures it requires studio of about 20 feet, less distance for bust-portraits. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 18 feet, will appear 4 1-2 inches long on the ground-glass. \$135 00

All the Lenses now following, may of course serve for taking pictures of single persons, busts, as well as groups, but, as for the latter, more equal division of light and more depth of focus is required, we recommend for large groups, the Lenses Nos. 7a, 8a, and 9a, while for single portraits, busts and smaller groups, the Lenses Nos. 6, 7, 8 and 9 are preferable, having the advantage of producing pictures of greater plasticity and brilliancy,

No.6. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 4 1-4 and 4 3-16 in. diameter. Equivalent focus 364 Mm., (back-focus 11 inches). Completely mounted, with central stops, and adapted for taking pictures on plates 10 x 12 inches and smaller. \$162 50

This Lens will be found a most useful one, for taking Cabinet Portraits, busts, groups, etc., working very quickly. We can recommend it to all who have plenty of room in their studios; it requires from 18 to 24 feet for full-length cabinet or promenade pictures; less distance for bust-portraits. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 20 feet, appears about 5 inches long on the ground-glass.

7. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achrematic Combinations of Lenses, 4 1-4 and 4 3-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 453 Mm., (back-focus, about 14 inches). Completely mounted, with central stops, adapted for taking pictures on plates 11 x 14 inches, and smaller. Its power of light is 2-5 less than the normal power of No. 6. For full-length, Cabinet

or Promenade pictures requires studio from 25 to 30 feet, and a person 5 1-2 feet tall at a distance of 20 feet, appears about 5 1-2 inches long on the ground glass. . . \$162 50

No. 7 a. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 4 1-4 and 4 3-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 565 Mm., (back focus, about 16 inches). Completely mounted, with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 13 x 16 inches, will do very well for 14 x 17. and smaller. A person 51-2 feet tall, at a distance of 20 feet, appears 7 inches long on the ground-glass. . \$162 50

- 8. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses of 5 1-4 and 5 7-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 565 Mm., (back-focus, about 16 inches). Completely mounted, with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 13 x 16 inches and smaller. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 20 feet, appears 7 inches long on the \$300 00 ground-glass.
- 8 a. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 5 1-4 and 5 7-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 676 Mm., (back-focus, about 20 inches). Completely mounted with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 17 x 20 inches and smaller. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 25 feet, appears 7 inches long on the ground-glass.
- 9. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 6 1-3 and 6 9-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 676 Mm., (back-focus, about 20 inches). Completely mounted with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 17 x 20 inches and smaller. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 25 feet, appears 7 1-2 inches long on the ground-glass. \$450 00
- 9 a. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 6 1-3 and 6 9-16 inch diameter. Equiva-

lent focus 780 Mm., (back-focus, about 24 inches). Completely mounted, with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 18 x 22 inches and smaller. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 25 feet, appears about 9 inches long on the ground-glass.

No. 10. Double-Objective, consisting of two Achromatic Combinations of Lenses, 8 1-4 and 8 9-16 inch diameter. Equivalent focus 1,144 Meter. Completely mounted, with central stops. Adapted for taking pictures on plates 27 inches. A person 5 1-2 feet tall, at a distance of 25 feet, appears about 12 1-2 inches long on the ground glass. \$1,000 00

REMARKS.

The optical and chemical foci of our lenses are perfectly coincident, and are carefully examined in this respect before being delivered.

We give the equivalent focus in Millimetres, (305 Mm. equal to 12 inches), also the back-focus in inches, of the Portrait Lenses.

The relative speed of our Lenses may be stated as follows: Nos 1, a, 2, c, 3, 5 and 6 are of the so-called normal speed. Nos. B & D are quicker by 1-3, and No. 4 has 3-5 more rapidity of action, than the corresponding lenses of same diameter, whereas Nos. 7, 8 and 9 require 2-5 longer exposure, and the lenses Nos. 3a, 7a, 8a, 9a and 10 possess only about half the rapidity of action.

All our Lenses are provided with central stops. It is to be observed, that at all events one of the diaphrams must be used, as otherwise side or top-light would enter through the slit; when no diaphraming is required, insert the largest stop.

To prevent the glasses, composing the back lens, from being replaced in a wrong way, when taken out to be cleaned, observe that the double-convex lens is to be put in the cell first,

the flatter side downwards; then follows the ring, and lastly the second lens with the concave side inwards. Care must be taken, that the ring which holds the glasses in the cell, is not screwed down too tightly.

Complaints are often made, that the glasses composing a lens, are not quite free from air-bubbles or small specks; these do not injure their working qualities in the least.

The No. 5 Portrait Lenses and all smaller sizes are now so constructed, that they can be used for making views. By taking out the back-lens and screwing the front lens in its place, and using the small stops, fine views can be made.

These Orthoscopic Lenses, under favorable circumstances, have been most successfully used in the open air, for taking large groups of persons; but they are especially intended for taking views, copying maps, and pictures. They consist, like our portrait combinations, of two achromatic lenses, with this difference, that only the front lens is a collecting one while the smaller back lens is of dispersing power.

The advantages that this orthoscopic combination possesses over the single achromatic lenses in use, for taking inanimate objects, are manifold. The orthoscopic combination, allows not only a larger, and flatter field, an increased amount of light

and precision, but also a more equal division of light, and sharpness.

The size of the picture to be obtained by these orthoscopic lenses varies according to the distance of the object to be taken; it is the smaller, the nearer the object, and the larger, the more distant it is. The two sizes stated in the catalogue for each orthoscopic lens, indicate therefore the largest sizes to be produced either for objects near or distant; for instance, with reference to lens No. 1, 182 Mm. is the largest size for near objects, whilst 260 Mm. indicates the largest size, for objects very distant.

The glasses composing the front lens of the orthoscopic combination, are cemented together, and fixed in the cell, but the two glasses of the back lens are loose, just as is the case with our portrait combination; care must be taken to replace them in their respective positions, when having been taken out of the cell, to be cleaned. The double-concave lens of crown glass, is to be put in first, with its flatter side downwards, then follows the concave-convex lens of flint glass, with the concave side inwards; both are fixed by the ring, which, however, must not be screwed down too tightly. These orthoscopic objectives like all photographic lenses, cannot be used conveniently without being diaphragmed, the diaphragms are not placed between the two lenses, but behind the back lens, and are fixed by means of a sliding cap, which, if no diaphragm with a smaller aperture is used, forms in itself, the diaphragm with the largest aperture.

INSTRUCTIONS:

The Lens as it is in the Tube has a focus of 15 Centimeters, and can be used for taking Portraits and Instantaneous Stereoscopic Views. For this purpose it will be necessary to employ a Diaphragm from about 29 to 33 Mm., or smaller according to the light.

There can be but little doubt that the above will soon supersede all others for viewing purposes, on account of its lessened weight and greater compactness. The bellows is conical in shape. The bed of the camera is folding, and is provided with a focussing screw. The double swing-back is composed of Nelson Wright's Patent Metallic Support for the vertical swing, and the thumbscrews, which fasten the camera-box to the bed, form the second or lateral swing.

THE KNICKERBOCKER STAND.

This stand, made in five styles, finds great favor, being simple in construction and pleasing in outline. It is mounted on bracket casters, admitting rapid and easy movement to any required position. The legs are of iron, and the upright and top are in black walnut.



Each stand is packed in a separate box. The tops are attached to the upright with screws, in metallic ears, and the legs are firmly fastened with screws to the centre-piece, and are removed when packed. 

Frequent inquiries for something at a much lower price than an album, for the holding together and preservation of photographs, has induced us to manufacture an article which we think will meet the want. It serves all the purposes of an album, for a series or a set of Portraits, Landscapes, or Photographs of any kind, may be neatly and cheaply bound in these covers. They are made with expanding backs, so that from six to twenty-four pictures may be inserted in one cover.
