Generation 1

1. **William Bond**-1 was born about 1715 in Gloucester County, Virginia, USA_[1]. He died before 14 Jul 1768 in South Farnham Parish, Essex County, Virginia, USA_[2].

Notes for William Bond: General Notes:

History of Kentucky, Vol. 5 by By William Elsey Connelley, Ellis Merton Coulter, 1922, p. 545: a biography of William W. Bond, b.1891, a descendent of William Bond of Gloucester Co.: "...The Bonds are of English origin, the American ancestors having come from England to Virginia at a very early day."

Records of Gloucester Co. (many of which no longer exist) do not mention a William Bond. The first mention of him being from Gloucester Co. is a deed in Essex Co., VA: , dated 16 Nov 1761, in which he purchases 126 acres of land in South Farnham Parish, Essex Co. from Francis Smith and wife Anne. William Bond is referred to as "William Bond of [Blank] Parish in the County of Gloster, Planter." The "Blank" in this case apparently was the parish name in Gloucester in the original deed that the county recorder for Essex County could not read. South Farnham Parish is the southern part of Essex Co., which borders Middlesex Co. (see Figure 1). North Farnham Parish, incidentally, is on the north side of the Rappahannock River and lies in Richmond County. The two Farnhams were established at a time when both were in Old Rappahannock County, which included both the current Essex and Richmond Counties.

Essex County lies on the south bank of the Rappahannock River, an estuary (river flooded by salt water) off of the Chesapeak Bay. It is bordered by the Rappahannock on the north, by Middlesex County on the east, by Spotsylvania Co. on the west, and by a river known as "the Dragon Swamp" on the south (see Figure 1). The land in tidewater Virginia does not possess much altitude or relief, and that rivers were routinely referred to as "swamps" provides some insight into the character of the land. For many years, the Dragon Swamp was an almost impassable impediment to travel between Middlesex and Gloucester, until a bridge was built . Compare the impediment imposed by the Dragon Swamp to the highway of travel and commerce provided by the Rappahannock.

William Bond's deed mentions that the land being transferred lies next to "Webb's Mill Swamp." In 1763, William Bond was ordered to "procession the lines" from "the Old Mill Swamp that leads to Piscataway Creek to William Cheney's (land) on the Dragon (Swamp)". Current maps of Virginia show a Mill Creek that empties into Piscataway Creek and also parallels the Dragon. This area, some 5-6 miles due south of Tappahannock, is undoubtedly the area walked by William Bond. His farm would have been close by.

In 1703, about the time that William was born, Gloucester was the most populous county in Virginia, comprising 2628 males and 3206 females and children; by contrast, Essex Co. at that time had but 1090 males and 1301 females and children . However, by 1760, Essex Co. was quite populated.***data*** as people moved inland from the sea-coast. The same tax list that gives us a population of Gloucester Co. in 1703 also shows that none of the Gloucester land owners were named Bond. The usual progression of a Virginia colonist was from indentured servant/laborer to renter/farmer (often leasing land from the former master) to land owner/planter. Either the Bonds of Gloucester were still leasing at this time, or were yet to move to Gloucester from elsewhere.

William Bond married Constant (or Constance) Davis of Middlesex Co., VA. She was born on 10 March 1716 and she first married Robert Smither (or Smithey) on 24 Sep 1731. Robert Smither died in 1735 (check). William Bond is documented to have married Constant Smither in Middlesex Co. 24 Oct 1738. No children for William and Constant are listed at Christchurch, so presumably their children were baptized (if at all) in a Gloucester Parish (which ones?), for which records do not now exist. Judging from the age of Constant, William was born probably around 1710 +/- 10.

William was referred to as "planter" in his Essex deed, which 1) tells that he was a planter of primarily tobacco, but also 2) tells that he enjoyed a certain social status. He was considered on the middle tier

of a three-tiered social heirarchy in which the elite were referred to as "so-and-so, Gentleman", the middling were referred to as "so and so, Planter", and the bottom referred to as simply "so and so". Social status was hard-won and persisted through the generations by careful selection of eligible marriage partners having equivalent status. That William Bond had attained some such status is also shown by the literacy of his family. There is no example of his signature, but his son, William, and his father-in-law, John Davis both could sign their names. This places them among the educated **** % of tidewater Virginia.

He bought 126 acres in Essex Co. and would have probably had a similar acreage in Gloucester Co., where he farmed from perhaps 1740 (the time of his marriage) to 1762 (just after the deed was recorded). Considering that his grandchild Anne Bond was christened in Kingston Parish in 1762, he may have then lived in that part of Gloucester Co. that became Matthews Co. in 1791. By the time of his marriage, 1740, land in Gloucester would have all been long since claimed. Since he owned land in Gloucester Co. (he would not have been accorded the title "Planter" otherwise), it would not be surprising if he was the oldest surviving child in his family, and inherited it.

Tobacco planting was a profitable but labor intensive occupation - one which lent itself well to the importation of slaves to perform the labor: "The Virginia Planters sow the Tobacco-seeds in Beds, as the Gardeners in England do Colwort-seeds; they leave them there a Month, taking care all that time to have them well weeded. When the Plants are about the Breadth of ones Hand, they are removed in the first rainy Weather, and transplanted into what they Cal Tobacco Hills. In a Month's time the Plants will be a Foot high, and they top them, and then prune off all the bottom Leaves, leaving only seven or eight on the Stalk, that they may be the better fed by the Top, and these Leaves, in six Weeks time will be in their full Growth. The Planters prune off the Suckers, and clear them of the Horn-worm twice a Week, which is call'd Worming and Suckering; and this Work lasts three Weeks or a Month; by which time the Leaf from green begins to turn to brownish, and to spot, and to thicken, which is a Sign of its ripening. As fast as the Plants ripen you must cut them down, leave them in the Field for half a Day, then heap them up, let them lie and sweat a Night, and the next Day carry them to the Tobacco-house, where every Plant is hanged one by another, at a convenient Distance, for about a Month or five Weeks; at the End of which time they strike or take them down in moist Weather, when the Leaf gives, or else 'twill crumble to Dust; after which they are laid upon Sticks, and cover'd up close in the Tobacco-house for a Week or Fortnight to sweat, and then opening the Bulk in a wet Day, the Servants strip them and sort them, the top Leaves being the best, and the bottom the worst Tobacco."

William did own slaves; three are mentioned by name in a posthumous agreement between his wife and son.

Tobacco was almost the universal crop, and was so common and coin so scarce that most transactions were either barter or for tobacco. Wages and accounts could be paid in pounds of tobacco.

"The trade of this Colony, as well as that of Maryland, consists almost entirely of Tobacco; for tho' the Country would produce several extraordinary Commodities fit for Trade, yet the Planters are so wholly bent on planting Tobacco, that they seem to have laid aside all Thoughts of other Improvements. This Trade is brought to such Perfection, that the Virginian Tobacco, especially the sweet-scented, which grows on York River, is reckoned the best in the World..."

However, the Bonds would have grown other crops, such as corn and wheat, as well as raised livestock, as did most Virginians by the middle of the 18th century . The inventory of William's son (1776) contained sheep, swine and cattle as well as implements more suited to corn than tobacco growing .

The only known child from the marriage of William Bond and Constant Davis is the William Bond who, after the death of the elder William, entered into an agreement on 14 Jul 1768 with Constance Bond, his mother, regarding the disposition of the property of William Bond dec'd. Constance was shortly to

marry Phillip Pendleton of King and Queen Co., VA, so to prevent any disputes concerning right of dower, William agreed to deliver "one negro woman named Sarah, one negro girl named Chriss, one black leather trunk, one small red trunk, and her side saddle..." The elder William had apparently died intestate prior to this date, although no evidence of his death was found in Essex Co wills, administrations or Order books. It is even possible that the William that purchased the South Farnham Parish land was the son, and that the father had already died in Gloucester Co. However, at the time of the above agreement, both Constance and her son were residents of Essex Co.

It is probable that the younger William was not the first born of William and Constant. Statistics on Middlesex Co., VA show that only 11% of eldest males in VA families were named after the father . That siblings are not mentioned in the agreement between young William and Constant, or that other siblings did not make agreements of their own with Constant, may have been that none survived. Infant mortality in 18th century Virginia was high: "Roughly one-third of newborn babies perished within the first 20 months of life, and nearly half were dead before they reached adulthood" . On the other hand, sisters may not have been mentioned in or had agreements regarding the estate, even if they had survived.

Constance married Phillip Pendleton of King and Queen Co., VA in 1768; she was then 53 years old. Records of King and Queen Co. do not reveal what happened to the future Mrs. Pendleton. Even Phillip Pendleton left no will there.

Little can be learned about Wm Bonds ancestry - the Gloucester records are mostly missing. John and William Bonds were present in York Co., and also Lancaster Co. was the home of many Bonds. Quite a few persons named Bond were imported via Head Rights into VA in the 1600's, any one of whom could have been the immigrint ancestor.

Constance Davis daughter of John Davis and Margaret was born on 10 Mar 1715/16 in Christchurch Parish, Middlesex County, Virginia, USA_[3]. She died after 1778 in Lancaster County, Virginia, USA_[4].

Notes for Constance Davis:

General Notes:

After looking through the Smither (Smithey) laden Christchurch Parish Register, no Constance Smithey was present. I then looked for any Constance and found two. Finally, I discovered Constance's first marriage, and her christening as Constance Davis.

In Witness whereof, the said parties have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and Year above Written. Sealed and delivered in the presence of us: Constance (her mark) Bond (seal)

Having been raised in Middlesex Co., and marrying the local Robert Smither, she married Wm Bond of Gloucester Co., VA in 1738. In 1761, they moved to South Farnham Parish, Essex Co., VA, where Bond died before 1768 14 Jul 1768, Essex Co, VA Deeds 30, p.188: Articles of agreement between Wm Bond (her son) and Constance before her upcoming re-marriage to Phillip Pendleton. For her dower, he gives her one negro woman named Sarah, one negro girl named Chide, one black leather trunk, one small red trunk, and her side saddle.

She removed to Lancaster Co. with third husband Phillip Pendleton.

William Bond and Constance Davis were married on 24 Oct 1738 in Middlesex County, Virginia, USA^[5]. They had the following children:

2. **William Bond**-2 (William-1) was born about 1740 in Gloucester County, Virginia, USA_[6]. He died about 16 Sep 1776 in South Farnham Parish, Essex County, Virginia, USA_[8].

Notes for William Bond:

General Notes:

William Bond was born in Gloucester Co., VA, presumably shortly after his parents, William Bond and Constant Davis, were married, i.e., approximately 1740. In approximately 1760, he married Fanny Walker b. 26 Jan 1745/6, the daughter of Henry and Anne Walker. That Walker was her surname and that she was the daughter of Henry and Anne is suggested but not proven by 1) starting with this generation "Walker" is used as a given name in the Bond line, 2) A Francis Walker was born to Henry and Anne Walker in Gloucester, the county where the Bonds then resided, 3) a Henry Walker witnessed the deed of William Bond in Essex county in 1761, and 4) the first born of William and Fanny Bond was named Anna. In April of 1762, the younger William Bond family was still in Gloucester to christen their daughter Anna Bond, but by the death of the elder William Bond, his father, about 1768, he was working the South Farnham Parish, Essex Co. land. But he was not working it alone, as his gift of slaves to his mother will attest. William Bond could sign his own name , had therefore been educated. In the inventory of his estate are found "2 architect'n books".

William Bond was likely a "gentleman farmer", who, while owning a farm, did not actually till the soil. As did many other farmers of mid-eighteenth century Virginia, he diversified from the traditional tobacco farming. The inventory of his estate showed 8 slaves, probably more than required to work 126 acres. The stock was varied: 1 young horse, 3 sows & 14 shoates, 11 sheep, 1 yoke oxen, 1 cow, 1 heifer, and 1 yearling. The inventory also shows items that would be considered luxurious for the times: "1 Looking Glass", and "1 old fiddle". Education was important to William; he specified in his will that his estate "be kept together to maintain and educate my Children..." His estate, however, would fall short of this goal; one of his sons would later be apprenticed to a carpenter, another would be apprenticed to a tailor.

Of his children, only the birth of Anna Bond (above) can be found in extant records. The others must be inferred. John Bond is the only child mentioned by name in the will, and was presumably the eldest son, since he was to inherit the land when he became of age. John deposed in his pension application of 16 Aug 1832 that he was 69 years old. This would make him born ~1763 and probably in Essex Co., the next child born after Anna. A Robert Bond was a contemporary of John Bond, came with John to Kentucky, and gave a deposition in John's behalf at the pension application

on 16 Aug 1832. This deposition included intimate family information which indicates a sibling relationship. On 17 Dec 1781, a Walker Bond was apprenticed to Thomas Johnson of Essex Co., VA to become a carpenter . Likewise, on 21 Jan 1782, a William Bond was apprenticed to Richard Jeffries of Essex Co., VA to become a tailor; Richard Jeffries was also one of the court-appointed appraisers of William Bond's estate. Yet another inferred brother is Thomas, whose will in Scott Co., KY was witnessed by Walker. Four of these brothers: John, Robert, Walker and Thomas, along with Robert Sale (John's brother-in-law) would all journey from Virgina to Scott Co., Kentucky in the late 1790's.

William died in 1776 at the age of ~36. Such an early death in Virginia was common, since there were few doctors and a pestilential climate. In William's will he "advises that my Land may be sold to the highest bidder by my Executors herein after named on credit, and the money arising thereby to be applied towards of other lands at the discretion of my said executors..." Apparently, Fanny nor the boys were able or had any interest in managing the farm as it was. When John would become of age (21) Fanny was to receive a loan of "her choice of any three of my Negroes except Harry, one feather-bed and furniture, and seven pounds worth of any other household or kitchen furniture as she may choose..." Harry would eventually go with William, the youngest of the Bond children . The elder William's inventory shows 8 slaves: Harry, Sam, wenches Poll, Venus, Jane, and Chris, an old fellow York, and a girl Peggy, which comprise 400 L of his 579 L estate (exclusive of land).

The land was sold on 2 Feb 1778 for 101 pounds 5 shillings by Alexander Saunders, the executor of William Bond. Shortly thereafter, Saunders died, not having re-invested the proceeds in other lands, which resulted in a lawsuit between John Bond and Saunders estate (see John Bond #4 for details).

Fanny presumably returned to her Walker relatives after her husband's death. Her son, John enlisted in the Continnental Army in 1778/1779 in King William County, a long-time Walker homeland. Fanny Bond the widow was not the Fanny Bond who married Ralph Wormeley of Lancaster Co., VA in Aug 1784; that Fanny belongs to the branch of Bonds associated with the Sharpe family, and her marriage to Ralph Wormeley was her first .

Have granted, Bargained, sold, aliened, Enscoffed and Confirmed and by these presents Do fully freely & absolutely Grant, Bargain, sell, alien, Enscoff and Confirm unto the said William Bond all that piece of parcel of Land scituate lying and being in the aforesaid Parish of South Farnham and County of Essex adjoining on Webbs mill swamp and the Lands of Andrew Allen, Edward Bomer, Henry Crutcher, John Blatt and the said Francis Smith containing One hundred and Twenty Six Acres be the same more of Less. It being Part of the Tract of Land whereon Nicholas Smith the Younger decd lately dwelt which was given to him by his Father Nicholas Smith the elder deceased by deed and the said Nicholas Smith the younger dieing Intestate, the said Land descended to the said Francis Smith party to these presents as Eldest Brother and heir at Law. And also all houses, out houses, edifices, buildings, yards, gardens, orchards, pastures, commons feedings, trees, woods, underwoods ways, paths, waters, water courses, easments, profits, commodities, hereditaments, rights, privileges, members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises or any part thereof belonging or in any wise appertaining the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders of all and singular the said

premises and all the Estate right, title interest, use, prssession, property, trust, [dam?] and demand whatsoever both in Law and Equity of them the said Francis Smith & Anne his wife of in to or out of all and singular the said premises hereby granted, bargained or sold to any part thereof with the appurtenances.

To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of Land and all and every the premises hereby granted or mentioned or intended so to be with the appurtenances unto the said William Bond his heirs and Assigns for ever to his and their own proper use, benefit and behoof. and the said Francis Smith and Anne his wife, their heirs, Executors and Administrators, the said hereby granted premises and every part thereof with the appurtenances unto the said William Bond his heirs and Assigns the said Francis Smith and Anne his wife and their own proper use, benefit and behoof.

In the name of God, I, William Bond, of South farnham p'sh in the County of Essex, being sick and weak of Body but of sount sence and memory do make and Ordain my last will and Testament in Manner following (viz.).

-I desire that my Land may be sold to the highest bidder by my Executors, herein after named oon Credit and the Money arising thereby to be Appliced towards the purchase of Other Lands at the discretion of my said Executors which when purchased I lend to my beloved Wife, Fanny, during her Natural life, and at the deturmination thereof I Give to my son John Bond and his heirs forever the said Lands.

-I desire that all my Estate (after paying my Just debts) be keeped togeather in order to maintain & Educate my Children under the management of my Wife till my son John Bond arives to Lawfull age at which period I lend to my beloved Wiffe her choice of any three of my Negroes except Harry, one Feather bed and furniture and Seven Pounds worth of any other household or kitchen furniture as she may choose, to be valued by three home & house keepers

-and all my other Estate be it of which nature or kind soever I give it to be equally divided among all my then surviving Children and their heirs forever.

-at the decrease of my wife, I Give the Negroes and personal Estate lent her to be equally divided among all my Children then living and to their heirs forever.

-Lastly, I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Fanny and my friend Alexr Saunders and William Young Exex & Exors of this my Will hereby revoking all others by me heretofore made.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th day of March, 1776.

Signed, Sealed, Published and declared by the Testator as his last} William bond (seal) Will in the presence of us}

p. 357: May 1778. On the motion of William Gatewood, ordered that Thomas Boughton, Thomas Evans, Smith Young, and Richard Jeffries do settle, order and as Sounders Administer Accounts of the Estate of William Bond, decd and Report their finding therein to the Court.

p. 501: 25 May 1781. James Djernatt is appointed Guardian to Thomas Bond, orphan of William Bond decd whereupon the said James together with William Young his security entered into and acknowledged a bond according to law.

p. 508: 29 Dec 1782. Samuel Peachy, William Smith, Thomas Evans and John Evans or any three of them are appointed to settle and divide the Estate of William Bond, decd + report their proceeding therein to the Court.

Fanny Walker daughter of Henry Walker and Anne was born on 26 Jan 1745/46 in Abingdon Parish, Gloucester Co., Virginia, USA_[9]. She died after 1789.

Notes for Fanny Walker: General Notes: Abington Parish Register, Glocester, VA Fanny Walker, dau. Henry and Anne Walker DOM: estimated from age of daughter, Anna

A mention of Francis Walker Pendleton in section 81 of Records of Ante-Bellum Southern Plantations microfilm, but this is a male c. 1808.

William Bond and Fanny Walker were married about 1760 in Gloucester County, Virginia, USA (or Essex County)^[7]. They had the following children:

i. **Anna Bond** was born in Apr 1762 in Gloucester County, Virginia, USA (Kingston Parish)_[10].

- 4. iii. **Walker Bond**^[14] was born about 1764 in Essex County, Virginia, USA. He married Susannah Herndon about 1795. He died about Jan 1832 in Scott County, Kentucky, USA.
 - iv. William Bond was born about 1765 in Essex County, Virginia, USA.

Notes for William Bond:

General Notes:

William was apparently the youngest of the William family. It was he who was apprenticed last - to Richard Jeffries to become a tailor . If he was then 14 at this time, he would have been born 1767-8. In court orders, he chooses Richard Jeffries to be his guardian . Jeffries was one of the original appraisers of William Bond appointed in 1778, although the appraisal was ordered again. Jeffries may be a kinsman on the Walker side: IGI: Thomas WALKER Sex: M Event(s): Birth: Abt. 1653 Of Westmd Co., Virginia Marriage(s): Spouse: Mary JEFFRIES. This Westmoreland Walker is a likely ancestor for Fanny Walker.

There is a William Bond in King William Co., VA (near Essex) in the 1787 Personal tax list (0-0-0-3-8). Still there in 1797 Land (75ac); 1797 Personal (1-0-6-10; 6 slaves >16 & 10 horses). Wm Bond, Eliza Bond by will, 1815.

There is a Will Bonds in the 1810 and 1820 Scott Co., KY censes, but not on the same page as Walker or Robert.

DOB: he was younger than his brother John who inherited; guardian bond 19 Jun 1786 - probably he is 21 because Essex Co. Guardian Bonds p. 149 settled(0,031,247) 21 Jan 1782; Essex Co., Va Deeds 32, p 39: William Bond is apprenticed to Richard Jeffries to become a Tailor, possibly at the age of 16. Possibly did not accompany brothers to KY The preponderance of data is that he is right at 1765

3. **John Bond**-3 (William-2, William-1) was born about 1763 in South Farnham Parish, Essex County, Virginia, USA_[11]. He died on 12 Mar 1842 in New Liberty, Owen, Kentucky, USA_[13].

Notes for John Bond: General Notes: John Bond apparently signed a complaint against Wm Gatewood in 1793 as "John Warden Bond", the only time a middle name occurs in records.

John Bond was born and raised in South Farnham Parish, Essex Co., VA., the son of a planter/farmer. His birth date is somewhat in doubt. He probably was born after his sister Anna, or his baptism would have also been on record in Kingston Parish, Gloucester County. This would make his birth date ~1763, which is corroborated by testimony in 1832 (his Revolutionary War pension application) during which he was described as approximately 69 years old. However, during the same testimonies, he is described as enlisting in 1778 or 1779 at the age of 18, which would place his birth date earlier. The preponderance of evidence indicates 1763.

When he was only ~14, his father died. His father's will suggests that the Essex property be sold to support the family. The 126 acres in South Farnham Parish was sold by Alexander Saunders 2 Feb 1778 for 101 pounds 5 shillings. This is the same land that William Bond had bought 17 years earlier for 126 pounds. Saunders soon died. In the lawsuit John Bond vs. William Gatewood, executor of Alexander Saunders filed 21 May 1793, John alleged 1) that William Bond's will was written at a time, 17 Mar 1776, when depreciation of cash was not known, 2) that Saunders did not sell the land promptly after William Bond's death, when money was still undepreciated, but rather deferred the sale for over a year, during which time depreciation was ever greater, 3) that Saunders did not carry out the intent of William to purchase other lands of greater or equal goodness in a cheaper part of the country, and finally 4) that the proceeds were only worth one sixth of their former value by the time John got them.

In 1779, when John was about 16 years of age, he enlisted in the VA Continental Line, perhaps pretending to be 18. According to his deposition at his pension hearing, he enlisted in King William County. He may have lived there at the time, although tax records (that start in 1782) do not show that he returned there after the conclusion of the war. King William is a long-time ancestral home of many Walkers, who would be kin of John's mother, Fanny. He may also lived in King and Queen County, where a William Bond is shown in tax records c. 1790. Essex Orders show that John had activity in Essex Courts in the early 1780's. Essex, Middlesex, King and Queen and King William Counties are all in very close proximity. John and family could have lived in any one of them and conducted business in any other.

According to Robert Bond's deposition at John's Revolutionary War pension application, there was "trouble in the family" over John's desire to enlist - undoubtedly Fanny disapproved of her teenaged son going off to war. John enlisted anyway. His time in the army is documented in his own words in his application for pension:

"State of Kentucky, Owen Circuit Set.

On this 16th day of August 1832, personally appeared in open court, before Thos. M. McKay, circuit judge of Owen County now sitting, John Bonds, a resident of the county of Owen and State aforesaid, aged sixty-nine years of age, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. That he enlisted in the army of the United States in the year 1779 with Captain Drew and served in

the 4th or fifth Regiment Continental line, under the following named officers.

That he enlisted as a soldier of the revolutionary army - in the year 1779 as he thinks in the county of King William near Todds Bridge in said county, state of Virginia for [he] and during the war that had then been going on upwards of three years.

That when he enlisted, his captain was by the name of Thomas Drew.

That Captain Drews company marched to Williamsburgh where he rendezvoused at that place and formed a portion of Col. Porterfield's Regiment, which regiment he thinks was the fourth or fifth Regiment from Williamsburgh, the regiment to which he belonged marched to Camden in the State of South Carolina.

That he then formed a portion of General Gates Brigade.

That at this time his majors name was McGill, that he fought in the battle of Gates defeat, where Col. Porterfield fell.

That from Camden in South Carolina, Col. Porterfields regiment marched the remainder of them, which was about 50 in number, marched to the city of Richmond in the State of Virginia.

That from this place he marched to various places, ultimately he landed at Pointy fork of James River, where he was taken prisoner by the British.

That when he was took prisoner he was commanded by Capt. Ewell, the remainder of said Ewells and Drews company having formed Ewells.

That from said Pointy fork he marched as a prisoner to Richmond VA, from thence they then marched to James Town, then they were exchanged and became again to his army, after the Battle that Genl. Wayne had given the British and taken some prisoners from them,

That whilst he was in the custody of the British he had the small pox and when he was exchanged he went into the Hospital.

That he remained there about two months.

That he then went home on furlough for sixty days, given to him by Col. Ennis.

That after the sixty days was out he went into the service under Captain Ewell at Richmond, from there they marched to Williamsburgh, where he remained until the siege of York, the conclusion of the war.

The Captain Ewell's Company was deputed to guard the Barracks at Williamsburgh.

That after the Siege of York, Col. Ennis gave him a discharge from the Service of the United States at Williamsburgh.

That he has no documentary evidence of the aforesaid Services.

That he knows of no one by which he can provide the performancy of the aforesaid Services, except Robt Bond whose deposition is hereto annexed.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of any agency of any State of the Union. Sworn to & ascribed the day & year aforesaid.

John Szerod

And the said Court do hereby declare their opinion that the above named applicant was a revolutionary soldier and served as he states.

August Term 1832

The Siege of York ended with Cornwallis' surrender on 19 Aug 1781, so John Bond would have returned home about the end of that year, after having served approximately two years.

Between 1782 and 1789, John's whereabouts are not exactly known. He had been a ward of James Dejarnette , and It is possible he spent this time in the Dejarnette household, which in 1783 included 13 whites . Through his lawyer, John Warder, he obtained judgments, apparently against renters of his Essex Co. lands, in Essex Co. Courts , but that does not necessarily mean that he lived in Essex Co. If he did, he did not head his own household, for he does not appear in Essex Co. tax lists of the period.

In April or May, 1789 (the date is blank in the register, so only the month can be deduced from the surrounding records), he married Molly (or Mary) Sale in Caroline County, VA . She was the orphaned daughter of Robert Sale (d. 1779) of Caroline Co. The Sales had lived in Essex and Caroline Counties since the 1600's. Robert was the son of William Sale, son of Cornelius Sale, son of William Sale, the immigrant Sale ancester. Molly's siblings were: Samuel (of age in 1779), Robert,

John, Elizabeth, Polly, and William. The Sale children were named in a suit involving the slaves of William Sale the elder, of whom their father Robert Sale was a residuary legatee . Molly was born probably in the late 1760's or early 1770's; she is listed as the fourth of the five underage orphans in her guardianship papers . John and Molly were married by Rev. Theodorick Noell, who was minister at Salem, Upper King & Queen and Upper Essex Baptist Churches, and who was responsible for converting a great number of persons to the Baptist persuasion. The seat of his ministry, and likely the home of John Bond and his bride Molly, was the area near the common border of Caroline and Essex Counties.

Upon his marriage to Molly, John began a life-long association with Molly's brother Robert Sale and his wife, Jenny or Jane Hord, an association that would eventually lead through four counties and two states. The two men were both orphans, nearly the same age, came from old Virginia tidewater families, and both inherited the bulk of their fathers' estates, and so undoubtedly had more than a superficial similarity on which to base a friendship. Robert Sale had purchased a tract of 127 acres in St. George's Parish in Spotsylvania Co., VA in 1787 . Robert's great-grandfather, Cornelius Sale, had previously owned land in Spotsylvania Co. fifty years earlier . At the same time Cornelius owned land there, a John Bond, son of Robert with a wife Mary lived in the county . We do not know at this time any connection of these earlier Bonds and Sales might have had with Robert Sale's move to Spotsylvania. In 1790, he bought a second tract of 162 acres. This deed was witnessed by John Bond husband of Molly. So upon marriage, John and Molly had almost immediately joined her brother in Spotsylvania. Robert Sale, Molly's brother, would eventually accompany John and Molly to Scott Co., Kentucky, then on to Gallatin (Owen) Co., and his daughter Elizabeth would marry John's son Robert.

That the newlywed Bonds lived in Spotsylvania Co. probably changed the course of the rest of their lives. Spotsylvania Co. was the home of the preaching Craigs, and produced a blossoming of Baptist ministry. From here, Lewis Craig, whose brother, Elijah, was imprisoned twice for Baptist preaching in Virginia, would lead his church, the "Traveling Church", from Upper Spotsylvania Co. to the North Elkhorn River, Franklin Co., KY in 1785. From this beginning, other Baptist churches were formed or associated in Kentucky, including the McConnell's Run Church, Scott Co., near where John and family first settled in Kentucky, and the Ghent Baptist Church near New Liberty, Owen Co., where they would eventually settle permanently. That these Spotsylvanian Baptists were in Kentucky may have influenced John and Molly to move there. Certainly, John could have possessed land and/or property in Virginia - he arrived in Kentucky with several male slaves 16-21 years old, each of whom was worth several times the cost of a typical farm or plantation; he did not have to leave in order to obtain land and prosper. For whatever reason, go to Kentucky they did, and from this time forward, the Bonds would be Baptists rather than Episcopalian.

John Bond never owned land in Spotsylvania Co., and presumably lived with his bother-in-law. By 1794, Robert Sale and wife Jenny or Jane had divested themselves of both pieces of property in Spotsylvania Co. . By 1796, they had reached the settlements in Kentucky, both John Bond and Robert Sale paying taxes in Scott Co.

In 1796, John Bond (as Bonds) appears in the Scott Co., KY tax lists with 1 white male >21, no white males 16-21, 3 black males 16-21, 5 total black persons, and 2 horses. Robert Sale had an equally large and diverse family group. By 1800, his brothers Robert, Walker, and Thomas and Robert Sale all appear on the Scott Co. tax lists. It is probable that they all made the journey at one time, banding together for strength and support along the way. If so, they would have made a formidible party of upwards of 50 persons, children, livestock, and belongings. John and Molly brought two sons, William and Robert, who had been born in Virginia . They settled into the northern part of what is Scott Co., today, near the North Elkhorn River and McConnell's Run. These were outlying settlement areas to the main settlement at the Stamping Grounds, Franklin Co., KY. The north Kentucky area, including Scott Co., is shown in the map in Figure 2.

A William Bond also occurs in early Scott Co. records. This is not the last Essex Co., VA Bond brother, but rather a William F. Bond, b. 1740 in Hanover Co., VA, who married 2nd Sarah Cromson

in Woodford Co., KY 29 Nov 1790, and who is not at all or only very distantly related to our Owen Co. Bonds. He did, however, leave numerous Bond descendants, many of whom lived in the Anderson Co., KY area .

In transcriptions of the early records of Kentucky, the name Bond is often indexed as Bonds. I believe that this is due to an affectation in penmanship of a terminal "d" in handwriting of the time that can look like an added "s". The name can also appear in records as "Band", "Bona", or "Bones" due to other transcription errors. The name is and always was merely "Bond".

Robert Sale was the first to move north out of Scott Co., and is shown in Gallatin Co. tax records starting in 1802. In 1803, John Bond and family had left Scott Co. and followed the Sales to Gallatin Co. Brother Robert Bond followed later, leaving the brothers Walker and Thomas in Scott Co., where they would live out their days. Robert Sale would die by 1814; his property appraised by his long-time friend, companion and brother-in-law John Bond among others .

In 1808, John, at the age of ~45, purchased from Robert Mosby, for \$1 per acre, the land on which he would spend the remainder of his life, 73 and 3/4 acres on Two-mile Creek near Eagle Creek and the town of New Liberty. Eagle Creek forms the current border between Owen and Gallatin Counties, so the old Bond farm was in the part of Gallatin Co. that is now at the extreme northern part of the Owen Co., near Liberty Station (now Sanders). In 1808, New Liberty was the largest town, or perhaps about the only town in the area which would be Owen Co. In spite of this purchase, John would not completely divest himself of any interest in Scott Co. until 1817, when he sold his 100 acres on McConnell's Run there .

The area where John and Molly settled was probably mostly forested; the deed mentions elm, beech, locust and dogwood. Along with forest, cane may have been present, as well as meadows of clover. The description of land in Kentucky is by survey rather than township. A description of the land is made in reference to physical boundaries, such as rivers or streams, as well as legal boundaries, such as the edges or "lines" of other persons property. The corners of properties were marked by slashing or otherwise marking trees, whether living or fallen. These trees, now that over 200 years have passed, are long gone, but the land has remained in the Bond family, and is now owned by James (Jimmy) Bond (# ***).

1810 census, Gallatin, Gallatin, Kentucky: John Bonds 1-1-2-0-1 / 2-2-1-1-0 In 1810, the John Bond family is listed with five male children, two of them 16-26 (Robert and William), one of them 10-16 (Walker) and 1 of them <10 years of age (John), and five female children, one of them 16-26, two of them 10-16 and two of them <10 (one of whom is Elizabeth) . By 1813, some grave calamity or epidemic illness had carried away Molly Bond and four of her daughters. It is also possible that the eldest females had married and John felt no obligation to share the estate with them, but their marriages are not recorded in Gallatin Co.

But Molly died - sometime after 1810, when she is still present in the household in the 26-45 years of age category and before 1813. On 24 Jun 1813, John deeded at his death all his Negroes except one girl Caroline; they were, namely, a man Henry Armstend, woman Hannah and her young child Anney, and girl Rade, other daughter of Hannah to "my children, to wit: Robert Bond, William Bond, Walker Bond and John and Daughter Elizabeth Bond". This was done in anticipation of his remarriage, to make clear the disposition of certain of his estate upon his death. Two weeks later, on 7 Jul 1813, John married Johanna Holladay.

1820 census, Gallatin, Kentucky: John Bonds 3-0-0-2-0-1 / 1-0-1-1-0

1830 Census, Owen Co., KY: 4 males 5-10 yrs old, 2 males 10-15 yrs old, 1 female <5 and 1 female 15-20. So far I have children Frances (1815, the female 15-20), Buford (1817), Benjamin (1821/2), John 1825. This leaves the female <5, 2 males 5-10, and 1 male 10-15 unaccounted for. i.e. there are at least 5 more children of John and Johanna as yet unknown. This would mean that John sired altogether 16 children, some of whom were born while he was in his 70's.

John Bond's second wife, Johanna Holladay was the daughter of Benjamin Holladay, who had come with the "Traveling Church" from Spotsylvania Co., VA. She was born 1792-1795 (from her age as reported in the 1850, 1860 and 1870 censes) in KY. Benjamin Holladay had moved to Gallatin Co. by 1813, so she and John were neighbors now, even if he and Benjamin had been unaquainted in Spotsylvania Co. When they married, she was still in her teens, while John was over 50. Their union produced probably eight more children, the last of whom were born when he was in his 70's. Only six are known by name.

Gallatin Co., KY Deeds C, p. 41; 24 Jun 1813: (film 0,500,445) from John Bond to his children: Robert, William, Walker, John and Elizabeth. He deeds slaves now and the rest at his death. Made just prior to his 2nd marriage to Johanna Holladay.

Gallatin Co., KY Deeds C, p. 150; 1813 (film 0,500,445): Will of Thomas Calsan, thorugh the heirs of Benjamin Holladay of Spotsylvania Co., VA: gives to Johanna Holladay Bond and John Bond.

John left no document naming his children by Johanna. That these persons were children of John and Johanna had to be deduced from indirect evidence, such as living with Johanna after his death as in the case of Beuford, Warren and Allen, and entering into deeds with Johanna as in the case of John. See each child (below) for the logic connected him or her to John and Johanna.

As previously mentioned, John applied for in 1829 and received in 1832 and following years a pension for his Revolutionary War service . In it, he left a record of his signature: <signature>

After his death on 12 Mar 1842, his widow, Johanna, continued to receive his pension. He also received bounty land from his service *** (story).

No will or administrator's account marks his passing in Owen County probate records - only the division of his acreage so that one third of it would be a widow's dower for Johanna. Toward this end, Joel Harrison, Henry Blaketon and James H. Calvert (several upstanding yet disinterested parties in the county) met on the land on 6 Oct 1842, and laid out the dower as shown in the Owen County recorder's hand in Figure 3 . Johanna's section included "the mansion house and other buildings" and comprised 41 acres. The recorder's map of the property is shown in Figure ***.

In 1846, Johannah purchased from the aged Rev. John Scott, former County Surveyor for Gallatin Co., KY, Baptist minister for over 30 years at the Ghent Baptist Church, White's Run Baptist Church and others, landholder of considerable acerage, and the father-in-law of her step-daughter Elizabeth, a 50 acre parcel in Grant County, KY on the waters of Stephen's Creek. In less than a year, John Scott would be dead. Grant Co. is immediately east of Owen, and Stephen's Creek is in the westernmost part of Grant Co., a spot only 10-20 miles distant from New Liberty. In 1850, her son John is found in Grant Co. , and Johannah is found three doors away , living with her teenagers Warren and Allen.

By 1870, she, Warren and Allen (who now have families of their own) have moved back to Owen Co. She, aged 78, lives with son Beuford in Owenton. She died in 1880, presumably at Beuford's house.

During the great revival of 1788 many were baptised. The area is about 10 miles from Bowling Green at Sparta, VA (Sparta is at the edge of Essex and Caroline, and K&Q is not far away, so people living near here could have records in any of the three counties.

Mary Sale daughter of Robert Sale was born about 1769 in Caroline County, Virginia, USA. She died before 1813 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, USA.

Notes for Mary Sale: General Notes: DOB: estimated from marriage date DOM: Caroline Co., VA marriage bonds

DOD: date of John Bond's re-marriage Mary (Molly) was orphaned when young (<1779). That she is the Mary that married my John Bond is shown by: 1) John's son Robert marrying Elizabeth Sale, and 2) Robert Sale, Molly's brother, being married by the same minister (Theodoric Noel) and then coming to Scott Co. at approximately the same time as the Bonds. John and Molly's daughter Elizabeth was born 9 Apr 1803, after the move to KY. The lack of children after that date probably indicates that her death was nearer to 1803 than 1813, when John re-married.

John Bond and Mary Sale were married about Apr 1789 in Caroline County, Virginia, USA^[12]. They had the following children:

- i. Robert Bond was born on 25 Oct 1792 in Virginia, USA_[15]. He married Elizabeth Sale in Nov 1811 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, USA_[16]. He died on 20 Jan 1866 in Owen County, Kentucky, USA_[15].
- 8. ii. **William Bond** was born on 09 Sep 1793 in Virginia, USA_[17]. He married Harriet Scott on 18 Nov 1819 in Ghent, Carroll County, Kentucky, USA (formerly GallatinCounty until 1838)_[18]. He died on 12 Jan 1863 in Ghent, Carroll County, Kentucky, USA_[17].
- iii. Walker Bond was born in 1798 in Scott County, Kentucky, USA. He married Lucy Stegar on 01 Mar 1827 in Owen County, Kentucky, USA^[19]. He died about 15 Sep 1864 in Carroll County, Kentucky, USA.
 - iv. **John Bond** was born between 1800-1802 in Scott County, Kentucky, USA. He died between 1813-1820 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, USA.

Notes for John Bond: General Notes: Date of birth is from the order of siblings given below (he is the fourth of five) and therefore younger than Elizabeth (9 Apr 1803). He is also the male in the 1810 census of John Bond who is <10y - hence 1800-1802.

Mentioned in Gallatin Co. Deed Book C, p41 (1813) as a son of John Bond: Gallatin Co., KY Deeds C, p. 41; 24 Jun 1813: (film 0,500,445) from John Bond to his children: Robert, William, Walker, John and Elizabeth. He deeds slaves now and the rest at his death. Made just prior to his 2nd marriage to Johanna Holladay.

Johanna Holladay was born in 1792 in Kentucky, USA. She died in 1880 in New Liberty, Owen, Kentucky, USA.

DOB: variation in 1850 (Grant Co., KY p. 303), 1860 (Grant Co., KY p.858, and 1870 (Owen Co., KY p. 276) Census listings of age.

John Bond and Johanna Holladay were married on 21 Dec 1813 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, USA_[21]. They had the following children:

- 11. i. **Frances A. Bond** was born in Jun 1815 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, USA. She married William T. Allnutt on 10 Jan 1836 in Owen County, Kentucky, USA_[19].
- 12. ii. **Beuford Bond** was born in Sep 1817 in New Liberty, Owen, Kentucky, USA_[22]. He married Amanda Searcy on 19 Dec 1844 in New Liberty, Owen, Kentucky, USA_[19]. He died after 1900 in Owen County, Kentucky, USA.
 - iii. Benjamin Franklin Bond was born in 1821 in New Liberty, Owen, Kentucky, USA. He died about 28 Feb 1866 in Carroll County, Kentucky, USA.

Notes for Benjamin Franklin Bond: General Notes:

There are two Benjamin Franklin Bonds in Owen Co. The other is the son of William (John, William, William), that is, the half-nephew of this one. That this one is the son of John and Johanna Bond is shown by him living with W. Allnutt and Ann (nee Francis Ann Bond, his full sister) Allnutt in 1850, and the notes shown in the settlement of his estate, which were from Allen A. Bond and John Bond, his full brothers. No notes or references are made in the settlement to members of any other Bond family.

In 1850, he is listed as being a merchant. On 23 Jan 1865, a special session of the Owen Co. Court was held. The sole business of this session was Commonwealth of Kentucky vs. Benj. Bond, a writ de lunatic [inguendo]. Affadavits of Dr. J. F. Blanton and Cr. Jno Stackhouse allowed the jury of 12 to determine the following verdict: "We the jury find that Benjamin Bond is a person of unsound mind and a lunatic - that he lost his mind about three years ago from causes unknown - that he was born in Owen County, Kentucky on the 4th day of September, 1819 and now resides in Owen County, KY - that he has not been brought into this state by any person for the purpose of becoming a charge on the Commonwealth - that he has the following estate, to wit - one slave a negro boy near 20 vears old worth about \$200.00 and choses in action and money to the amount of \$500.00 that his father is dead and his mother is living in Owen County and that she has not estate sufficient to support said Benjamin Bond and that he is not capable of performing any labor for a support." John H. Beatty was appointed commitee for Benjamin after first executing a bond of performance (a promise to perform certain tasks or forfeit the bond) with Buford Bond securing or guaranteeing the bond. Benjamin died shortly thereafter. He apparently never married or had children.

DOB: 1850 Census, Owen Co., KY p. 222

That this Benjamin was the son of John Bond and Johannah Holladay is shown by: 1) Benjamin (28 yrs old) is living with William W. Allnut and Ann in 1850. The Ann in this case was formerly Francis Bond, John and Johannah's first born. 2) In the settlement of Benjamin's estate, accounts are made to A.A. Bond (Allen A. Bond, another John and Johannah sibling), John Bond (yet another John a Johannah sibling). No accounts are to any other Bond families, neither John's first family (by Molly Sale) or any other.

The settlement refers to Benjamin as "lately a lunatic but now deceased".

Notes for Allen A. Bond:

General Notes:

As for his borhter, Warren, Allen A. can be found living with his mother Johanna Bond in 1850, and in Warren's household in 1860. According to the 1850 entry, he was born in 1836/37. His father would have been over 75 years old at the time.

On 26 Jul 1860, he sold to his brother John Bond 10 1/2 acres on Stephen's Crrek in Grant Co. There is no indication in Grant Co. deeds of how he arrived at title to this land. John had previously (31 Mar 1859) purchased 40 acres on Stephen's Creek from the estate of John Scott .

Allen died at about age 26, unmarried, and presumably still in Grant Co., though his brother Beuford was appointed administrator of his estate in Owen Co. on 15 Aug 1864.

4. **Walker Bond**-3 (William-2, William-1)^[14] was born about 1764 in Essex County, Virginia, USA. He died about Jan 1832 in Scott County, Kentucky, USA.

Notes for Walker Bond:

General Notes:

Walker was born in South Farnham Parish in Essex Co., VA c. 1765-68, judging from the date of his apprenticeship. He was orphaned in 1776, and the his mother remarried in 1784, probably contributing to the Bond boys tendency to stay close to one another through their lives. [Internet World-Tree says 7 Jul 1865]

His name was not mentioned in his father's will, other than his father directing that the estate provide education for the children. That Walker is actually a child of William Bond is shown by 1) there appear to have been no other Bond families in the Essex Co. at the time, 2) Walker's apprenticeship is adjacent to his brother William's in the records (and William is definitely established as a son of William), 3) his brother, John Bond (#4 above), named one of his children Walker, one could not, and 4) that he came to Kentucky and lived in close proximity to the other three brothers.

He was apprenticed to Thomas Johnson to become a carpenter on 17 Dec 1781. Undoubtedly, his father's affinity for architecture had something to do in the choice of carpenter for Walker. Carpentry tools were inventoried in William's estate - Walker may have used or inherited these tools. Normally, a boy would be about 14 when apprenticed. This would make Walker born c. 1767-8. However, his brother, William was apprenticed just a month later, so, unless they had been twins, the 14 year-old rule was not adherred to in at least one of these cases.

Whether he accompanied his bother John to Spotsylvania Co., VA is not known; he was too young to have a household of his own at that time. The first record of him in taxes is in Scott Co., KY in 1800, where is is shown with 1 white male > 21 yrs old, no white males 16-21, no blacks, no horses and no land shown. By 1801, he had acquired 1 black and 2 horses. In 1802 a second black was added, and in 1803, one of the slaves had just turned 16 - another field hand. In **** he is shown with land for the first time: 100 acres on LeComptes Run, entered by Kirtner. The deed is not on record, as early deeds of Scott Co. were destroyed, and the only deeds to be found earlier than 1837 were ones that were brought back to the courthouse after the fire and re-recorded. Walker's was not among the ones brought back.

Walker's family is somewhat of a mystery. He married Susannah or Susan (surname unknown), but was it in Virginia or Scott Co., KY? The same fire that destroyed the land records also destroyed the early marriage records of Scott Co., so we may never know. Five children are mentioned in his will, and by name, but their whereabouts after his death are not known. They must have left the eastern Kentucky area. Their birth dates given are necessarily merely guesses.

Walker and Susannah were members of the Stamping Grounds Baptist Church, he baptized in Sep 1821. Considering that he entered the area 21 years earlier, it took him a while to get around to it. She was expelled from the Stamping Grounds church in Aug 1835 "for joining the reformers".

Walker died in later Dec 1831 or early Jan 1832. His will was written 6 Dec 1831 and the will was presented in court and recorded at the January session, 1832. He left the estate to Susannah with the provision that after her death it be divided between "my five children". He mentions that Julia, his oldest daughter, had already married, but does not indicate whom she married. By the death of Susannah in 1859, Julia is married to Richard C. Lindsay. The other children were: David, Thomas, Edward and Ann Elizabeth (called Eliza by Susannah in her will).

After Walker's death, Susannah remained in Scott Co. for some time - long enough to become entangled with those reformers, but she died in Carroll Co., KY. Her will was written 20 Nov 1852 and recorded 8 Mar 1859. In her will Thomas, who was the executor of his father's estate, is not mentioned at all, so he is probably deceased in 1852. Julia Lindsay, David H. and Edward Bond each

are bequeathed \$1 only, while the remainder goes to the youngest, Eliza, now married to ______ McDonald.

DOB: younger than brother John, and >45 yrs old in 1820 census. DOD: Scott Co., KY Wills E, p. 310

17 Dec 1781; Essex Co., VA Deeds 32, p. 35: Walker Bond is apprenticed to Thomas Johnson to become a carpenter.

Walker witnessed his brother John's application for Rev. War pension in 1833 in Owen Co., KY

Walker accompanied his three brothers to KY and was in Scott Co. by 1800. He is found in Scott Co. censuses through 1830.

I, Walker Bond of the County of Scott and State of Kentucky Calling to Mind the uncertainty of life, knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die [Cl...?] though of Perfect mind thanks to Almighty God for His Blessing as it has pleased Him to bless me with Some worldly property, it is my will and desire that after paying all my Just debts, it shall be disposed of in the following manner to wit:

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all my estte real and temporal of every Kind and description during her natural life and after Her death my will is that it shall be equally divided between my five children to wit: Julian, David, Thomas, Edward and Ann Elizabeth, with the exception that my four Youngest Children shall each Have a bid to make them equal with my eldest daughter that Has

married and left me.

I lastly appoint my son Thomas Bond Executor of this my last will and Testament, revoking all former wills by me made. In Testimony whereof, I Have Hereunto Set my Hand and Seal this 6th day of Decr 1831. Signed, Sealed and delivered in presence of us. [illegible except for last name of Alexander]

Scott Co., KY Will Book E, p. 32: 19 Mar 1828, Thomas Bond [probably the son of Walker] and Walker Bond & Presley Calvert are appraisers of the estate of John Millbank.

Carroll Co., KY Will Book 2, film 0,414,685: p. 494, will of Susan Bond, mentions daughter Juliet H. Lindsay, David H. Bond and Edward Bond (they each get \$1) - the remainder of the estate goes to Eliza McDonald; Susan makes her mark. teste: Jno C. Lindsay, James McCann (xeroxed).

There is a Thomas E. Bond (b. MD) in Scott Co., KY in 1850 who raised a large family. He is the son of Lawrence Stern Smallwood, who changed his name to Bond after receiving a large inheritance from Dr. Thomas Bond, d. 1794 while surveying in VA. Wierd, eh?

Susannah Herndon daughter of David Herndon and Charity Sinclair^[14] was born on 13 Feb 1777 in Virginia, USA^[14]. She died on 05 Feb 1850 in Carroll County, Kentucky, USA^[14].

Notes for Susannah Herndon: General Notes: DOB: estimated will, Carroll Co., 2-494 Name: not mentioned by name in Walker's will - only "my wife" (Scott Wills E-310 second E book). But her own will mentions the same children, only the girs are married, and Thomas apparently has died. Her will is called "Susan Bond", but given her age, she was probably born and married as Susannah.

census of Callaway Co., MO, he is a 47 year-old shoemaker, living alone, and living next to Edward S. Herndon, a friend from his Scott Co., KY days. By the 1860 census, he is no longer in Callaway Co. His middle name may have also been Herndon.

He came to MO approximately 1836 with his two brothers, Edward and Thomas, Edward S. Herndon, and John T. Yates.

iii. Thomas H. Bond_[14] was born between 1804-1810 in Virginia, USA. He died before 1859.

Notes for Thomas H. Bond: General Notes: It may be hypothesized that his middle name was Herndon.

He is in his father's household in the 1820 (10-16) and 1830 (20-30) censes.

Date of birth: he is one of the 10-16 year males in 1820 census and is younger than David (1803) and older than Edward (1813) - hence 1804-1810.

He was the co-executor of his father's estate in 1832.

Notes for Thomas Bond:

General Notes:

Thomas Bond was born in South Farnham Parish, Essex Co., VA. From the age stated on his tombstone in Scott Co., KY, 69, he would have been born in 1765-1766. He was orphaned at the age of 12, with the majority of the estate going to his brother John. Unlike his brothers Walker and William, he does not appear to have been an apprentice in some craft. He did, however, have James Dejarnette appointed as his guardian. James Dejarnette was also the guardian of Thomas's brother John at approximately the same time.

He may have followed brother John to Spotsylvania Co., VA, before traveling with him to Scott Co., KY. By 1797, he is paying tax in Scott, Co., KY, and by 1820 had ammassed over 1000 acres on LeComptes Run, land originally entered by Kirtner. His brothers Robert and Walker lived nearby while they were in Scott Co.

In about 1814, he married Mary Ann Yates, also known as "Nancy", who was the daughter of Joseph Yates and Mary Thomas Yates, and who was born 1791-1792 in Kentucky. He would have been almost 50 years old at the time. If he was married previously, there was no issue and his wife was dead by 1810.

Thomas apparently never was a member of the Stamping Grounds Baptist Church, located nearby, but Nancy was baptised there in July 1821. He died 23 Jun 1828, at the age of 62, and is buried in a cemetery on Bond's Pike. His last child was born only months before his death. His will was recorded 20 Jul 1828. He left the common legacy of everything to his wife during her life, then to whatever children may be alive. The will was proven in court by Thomas's brother Walker and John Johnson . The executors named in the will, John T. Yates and Isaac Adams refused to act in that capacity, so Nancy was named Executrix . Nancy died 31 Aug, 1832 and is buried in the Stamping Grounds cemetery . Their family is taken mostly from Echoes of the Past in the Western Part of Scott County, The Stamping Ground Womans Club, 1980, Vol. II, p. 262 & ff.

On 17 Sep 1832 Robert Bond, over 14 years old and son of Thomas and Nancy, both deceased, chose John T. Yates his guardian. Mr Yates was also appointed guardian for Elizabeth, Joseph, and Sarah Bond, who presumably were not over 14 years old.

Thomas Bond and Walker Bond of Scott Co. served together on several appraisals in Scott Co. Long after Thomas's death in 1828, his son, William moved to New Liberty, Owen Co., KY, near the kin of John Bond This seemed to indicate kinship. Kinship is proven in Essex Co., VA Orders, where Thomas is an orphan of William Bond and chooses James Dejernat as guardian (Orders 25 May 1781, p. 508). John Bond was mentioned in the will of William (unlike any other siblings), and also chose at one time to have James Dejernat as guardian (Orders 20 Feb 1780, p. 465). Brothers William and Walker are apprenticed at approx. the same time, same place (Essex Co. Deeds).

Due to the age difference between Thomas and Nancy (he is 26 years older), there is a possibility of an earlier marriage in VA, but no children of such a marriage known in KY.

Notes for Robert Bond:

General Notes:

Robert Bond's birthdate is not quite clear. On one hand, his brother, John, was probably older than he, since it was John who inherited their father's land . Yet in the 1830 census , John is listed as 60-70 while Robert is listed as 70-80. If he were over 70 in 1830, i.e. born c. 1759, his mother would have been 14 at his birth, young even by Virginia standards. It is much more likely that the census is incorrect. His guardian account was settled on 19 Jul 1790 , at which time he was probably 21 or slightly older. Therefore, the best estimate is that he was born c. 1767/1768.

He, like brother John, was orphaned at a young age. He, unlike John, was not mentioned in his father's will, except the provision for "education of my children." That provision, at least, was satisfied; he was able to sign his name.

In his account settling with his guardian, William Saunders on 19 July 1790 (see above), the bulk of the account is for clothing or materials for clothing: 3 vds duffle 1 felt Hat 6 vds Irish linen 1 pr shoe buckles 1 pr knee buckles To John Bogie for making suit of Clothes 1 doz bia buttons 6 yds Virginia for Shirting Other accounts include: To Wm. Atherson for 8/2 bushels of Corn for your schooling 1786: To your board for this year 12.0.0 To paid Col. Wm. Gatewood (one of the appraisers of William Bond's estate) for your proportion of expence in settling your father's estate: 0.8.11 1788: To keeping negroe Jenny & her 3 Children: 3.0.0 To 1 Blanket 1/6 yd Flannel for Jenny's Child: 0.0.9 To midwifes fee: 0.11.0 1789: To John Bougan for his attendance in a suite brought for you: 0.12.6 Accounts on the plus side were had from Edmonson (first name unknown) and Francis Duvall for

bonds due, cash from the hire of "old Dennis", and a bond from James Dejarnette, the guardian of brothers John and Thomas. When all was accounted, Robert's estate of L 38.7.8 had dwindled to L 2.7.5. For many an early Virginian, the bulk of his estate would be the value of their slaves, and Robert was no exception. At the tender age of 21, and having only L 2 and change in his pocket, he was the owner of (and thereby responsible for providing for) Jenny, her three or four children, and "old Dennis".

He married Fanny Sale, according to a FHC Ancestor File entry, and this is reasonable, though unsubstantiated, since one of their daughters would also be called Fanny. The marriage, from his age and birth date of first known child, would have taken place c. 1795, and therefore would have taken place in Spotsylvania Co., if he had follwed brother John and Robert Sale there. The parentage of Fanny Sale is unknown at this time. Obviously, she is related in some way to Molly Sale, the wife of Robert's brother John. But Fanny, whose actual name was probably Frances, was not Molly's sister, as there is no Fanny or Francis in the list of Molly's orphan siblings in Caroline County . The Sale genealogy, which primarily takes place in Essex Co., VA and later in Caroline Co., VA (whose records are scant), has yet to be written for their part of the family (but see Root and Branch of the Sale Family by Dorthea Sale Goodman, 1939). Fanny was 50-60 in the 1830 census, so would have been born c. 1780 .

Shortly after their marriage, Robert and Fanny accompanied or followed the other Bond brothers to Scott Co., KY. He paid taxes in 1800 on 100 acres of land on LeComptes Run, land originally entered by Kertner or Kertin and surveyed and patented by Robert Patterson. His brothers Walker and Thomas also held land on LeComptes Run entered by Kertner . so presumably, the three brothers were within shouting distant of each other. He stayed on this property until moving to Gallatin Co. in 1817. *** What land in Gallatin, where. At his death, he lived next to H.H. Dejarnette, undoubtedly a relation of the guardian of John and Thomas Bond back in Essex Co., VA.

Scott Co., KY Wills B-95 1 Aug 1814: In 1814, a Robert Bond obtained a bond with David Herndon for a license to keep a tavern. The Herndons were yet another family that originally dwelt in Spotsylvania Co., VA, and associated with the Bonds for generations. By this time, Robert was paying taxes in Gallatin Co., not Scott Co., but no other Robert Bonds are present, so the act must have been his. Perhaps he was a "silent partner" in the tavern business.

In 1829, he supported his brother John's application for a pension. His signature can be found in this pension file (W5225). <signature>

Fanny died 1840-1849. Robert died in 1849, leaving a detailed will and codicil which (so he thought) equitably divided his personal estate (Negroes and cash) between his children, if alive, or grandchildren . It provided for essentially one slave going to each child portion, along with cash to make up for varying slave values. It is worth noting the difference in estate planning just one generation has made. Robert was not even mentioned by name in his father's will, and the land and estate went to John, whereas Robert went to elaborate lengths to make sure that his children knew that he was being entirely equitable in splitting his estate. Perhaps his experience as an orphan shaped his views on his legacy. In any case, what may have been equitable to his children must have been devastating to his slaves. There would be no more intact slave families after his death. To his credit, he also provided that "my faithful servants Lucy and Nanny be emancipated and set free at my death, and each of my aforesaid children be charged equally for their support during their natural lives". Within 14 years, all would be emancipated by law.

ROBERT BOND WILL

Owen Co., KY Will Book D, p.85-87: 20 Mar 1848; recorded May Term 1849

In the name of God Amen. I, Robert Bond Senr being weak in body but of Sound mind and disposing memory and being desirous of disposing of such Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and previous wills heretofore made by me.

First, I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be interred in a respectable and accepted manner at my death in my family graveyard on the side of my deceased wife.

Secondly, I desire that all my debts which are [outfers?] be paid as soon as practicable.

Thirdly, I have heretofre made advances to each of my children excepting deceased daughter Jane in amounts that suppose to make each equal and I desire that it be so [cirsidine?] and that no account be taken of said advancement and not having given to my deceased daughter Jane an amount equal to the others, I give and bequeath to her son James P. Orr (Jr.) my negro Girl Susan and her three children Malinda, John and Lucy and infant, which I consider sufficient in value to make him equal to any of my said children.

Fourthly, I desire that my tract of land upon which I now reside be divided by a line running as follows, to wit: Beginning at a sycamore standing in the spring branch Stewart's Corner, thence with the center of & up said branch to the water Gap near Bill's Heir House, thence to continue up the branch twenty-five steps on the north side of the same and Taking the right hand fork of the same (ascending) to the mouth of a drain just above the said gap on the right hand side, thence a straight line to the cummunal road opposite H.H. Dejarnette's present gate on said road and all of my said land that lies on the north side of said line - I give to my son Samuel S. Bond during his natural life to use and cultivate for his benefit and after his death and when his youngest child becomes of age Then to be sold upon The full terms and The proceeds equally divided among his children lawfully begotten not hereby giving to my said son Samuel S. Bond the [-----?] or right to rent of lease any portion of the said tract of land and all of the said tract of land lying on the south side of the aforesaid described line I give & bequeath to my son Robert S. Bond & his heirs forever.

Fifthly, Being desirous to Keep my negroes among my children and to prevent a sale of said slaves, I have placed the following values on them, to wit: I value Patty at \$400, Oliver (being sickly and unhealthy) at \$300, Louis at \$300, Dennis at \$600, Billy at \$700, Drusilla at \$300, Eliza at \$400, Dave at \$650, Isaac at \$350, Henry at \$300, and Crissy at \$300, making a total value of the slaves \$4800 and which I dispose of as follows: I devise that my son Robert S. Bond take and have Oliver and that he pay the sum of \$300 to my Grandchildren Hugh G., Peter G., Lewis, , Robert F., James H. and Samuel P. Smith to be paid to their guardians and by said guardians to them as they arrive at the age of 21 years; and further I desire that Walter Garnett and my daughter Clara take and have the above named girl Eliza and the Boy Isaac and pay the sum of \$150 for the same children and in the same manner and I further desire that my Grandson James P. Smith son of Jane take and have the

above named Boy Dave and pay the sum of \$50 for the same children and in the same manner. I devise that H. Gayle and my daughter Eliza Take and have the above named Boy Dennis and the Girl Drusilla and pay the sum of \$500 to my Grandchildren Mary, Nancy Adams, Newton and John Sale Samuel children of my daughter Louisa (deceased) to be paid to Their guardians and by their guardians to them as they arrive at the age of 21 years and I further desire that Fotheringill Brown and my daughter Mariah Brown have and take the above named boy Billy and pay the sum of \$100 for the benefit of my daughter Amanda, take and have the above named woman "Patty" and Boy henry and pay the sum of \$100 for the benefit of the said Hugh G., Peter G., Lewis, Robert F., James F. and Saml Smith to be paid in the same manner - and I further desire that William McClure and my daughter Fanny Take and have the above named man Lewis and Woman Crissy - hereby intending to divide said Slaves equally according to the vvaluation above placed on them among the said Sale & wife, Brown & wife, McClure & wife, Orr & wife, Garnett & wife, James P. Orr Jr., Saml. S. Smith's children and Louise Samuel children. Having disposed of my Land as aforesaid between my sons Saml. S. & Robt. S. Bond, I desire that they have nothing out of the value of said slaves and my desire is that said slaves be Kept in the family if practible.

Sixthly, I desire that at my death the remaider of my personal property of any kind & description be sold and the proceeds be equally divided among my aforesaid children & grandchildren giving to Smith's children a childs part, Louisa Samuel's children a childs part and Jane Orr's child James a childs part.

Seventhly, my will and desire is that my faithful servants Lucy and Nanny be emancipated and set free at my death and each of the aforesaid children be charged equally for their support during their natural lives each set of grandchildren to pay a childs part towards said support.

Eighthly, I constitute and appoint my son-in-law Henry Gayle and my son Robert S. Bond Executors of this my said Last will and testament. Should any of the slaves above devised die before the division takes place, then my will and desire is that they shall not be accounted for by the [air?] to which it may be allotted but the [remain?] divided in the above proportion and be accounted for so as to make the heirs equal as above.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 20th day of March, 1848, Robert Bond (seal)

signed, sealed, acknowledged, published and dictated in the presence of us, H. H. Dejarnette, Francis Moore.

CODICIL

Since the writing and publishing of the foregoing will I have upon reflection thought it advisable to make this alteration to wit: in order that Patty may have both of her children [Gase?] & Henry with her, I desire that James P. Orr and my daughter Amanda take the Boy Isaac instead of Waller Garnett & wife and that they pay to said Garnett & wife the sum of Two hundred dollars and to Saml & Polly Smith's children \$150 to be paid to them in the same manner as set forth within and said Garnett & wife to be released from this payment to said children of said sum of \$150 not intending Surely to alter or revoke any other portion of this will.

His inventory and sale bill show an assortment of farm and carpentry tools, 5 bedsteads, and a 32 piece set of china teaware, among other things. These items were sold amongst Granville Garnett, R.H. Gayle, F. Brown, W.H. Dejarnette, and others. William H. Garnett, probably a brother of Granville, had married Robert's daughter, Clara, and Fotheringill Brown had married another daughter, Maria. W.H. Dejarnette must be a descendent of the Dejarnette who was guardian of John Bond back in Virginia.

Robert Bond was the first born of John Bond and Molly Sale. He was born on 25 Oct 1792, although for some reason he is listed as 61 years of age in the 1850 Census of Owen Co., KY. The family was living in Spotsylvania Co., VA at the time, although by 1796, they had come to Scott Co., KY, and by 1803 finally to Gallatin Co., KY. He would have been about 4 years old during the long trip from

Virginia into Kentucky.

He married Elizabeth Sale, b. 1786, who was the daughter of Robert Sale and Jenny Hord, lifetime friends and companions of the John Bonds. Elizabeth was born either in Caroline Co., VA, the ancestral home of her branch of the Sale family, or Spotsylvania Co., VA, where her father is found purchasing land on 2 Oct 1787. The marriage of Robert Bones (sic) and Betsy Sail (sic) is recorded in Nov 1811 in Gallatin Co., KY. Robert Bond received a value of \$600 from the estate of Robert Sale, his father-in-law in 1813.

Robert made no purchases of land in Gallatin Co. during the first years of his life. As the eldest son of John Bond, he apparently inherited his father's acerage on Two Mile Creek - apparently because John Bond left no will giving the land to Robert, but we find that the same parcel eventually descended without recorded deed to James F. Bond, son of Robert.

General Notes:

William Bond, the second son of John Bond, was born 9 Sep 1793. At this time, the John Bond family was still in Virginia, probably Spotsylvania Co, near Fredericksburg. As a boy, he travelled with his father, mother and brother Robert first to Scott Co., KY in 1795/1796, and second to Gallatin Co., KY (later to become Owen Co.) in 1803.

According to a biography of William's son Robert L. Bond and also a biography of son Benjamin F. Bond, William was a "soldier of the war of 1812, in Col. Dick Johnson's regiment." Richard M. Johnson commanded a regiment of Kentucky militia consisting mostly of men from eastern Kentucky during the war of 1812, and is sometimes credited with killing the Indian commander Tecumseh. A William Bond, "Trumpeter", is listed in the roll of Johnson's regiment, Allen A. Hamilton's company . No federal pension file for William Bond exists, even though he lived past pension legislation, presumably because he was not in the regular army, but in the state militia.

On 18 Nov 1819, William Bond married Harriet Scott, the daughter of Rev. John Scott, the Baptist preacher in the area . Rev. Scott had joined William's father John and Johanna Holladay in marriage in 1813, but this day, the honors were performed by Henry Morgan.

On 1 Jan 1823, John Scott deeded to William Bond, "for and in consideration of an intermarriage with his daughter Hariat Scott, and for several good offices, and for the further consideration of one dollar", 184 acres on Stephen's Creek and McCool's Creek in Gallatin Co., KY (later to become Carroll Co.). It may not be a coincidence that at the time, Harriet was four month's pregnant with John Scott's grandson. McCool's Crrek parallels the Ohio River near Carrollton, KY. Stephen's Creek is located just east of Ghent. The property would have probably been located some 4-5 miles up Stephen's Creek on the current Sharon-Black Rock road, nearly on the border of Gallatin and Carroll Counties. The house shown in figure _____ is described as the house in which Robert L. Bond was born (1836) would have been built by William and Harriet on this property. Indeed, the syle of the house (late federal) would indicate a construction date of the 1820's, when William and Harriet had moved there.

In 1829, William and Harriet purchased another 55 acres on Stephen's Creek from John Sanders and wife, a plot presumably adjacent to the first .

William Bond died 12 Jan 1863. Harriet died six days later, 18 Jan 1863. His will mentions a grandson, James B. Lindsay, son of his daughter Mary Jane Bond and John C. Lindsay; Mary Jane had died previously in 1855. The will also mentions "my children: John C. Bond, James A. Bond, Benj. F. Bond, and Robert L. Bond." His will further states "If my son Rob't L. Bond, who is now absent from home in the army, should not live to get home or until peace is restored to our distracted country or until his term of service expires, I direct that such portion of my estate as is herein bequeather unto him, shall be equally divided and distrubuted among my three other children." Robert L. Bond had enlisted in the Confederate cavalry in 1862, and did make it home. The William Bond estate consisted of the land, 4 horses, a yoke of oxen, 21 sheep, a buggy and 7 slaves , in addition to household furniture .

The 1840 Carroll Co., KY census lists the six sons and four daughters. Therefore, one son and two daughters are as yet unknown.

And that she shall have the same during her natural life, and to be disposed of by her if shee may deem proper. I desire that my wife in addition to the above, shall have so much of my estate as she would be entitled to if no will were made by me.

Thirdly, I give and bequeathe unto my grandson James B. Lindsay five hundred dollars to be paid to him when he shall arrive at twenty-one years of age. In the meantime and until he shall arrive at that age, I direct that it be loaned out at interest upon good security. If he should not live until he is twenty one years old, then the five hundred dollars with accumulated interest, is to return to my estate and be equally divided among my children: John C. Bond, James A. Bond, Benj. F. Bond and Robert L. Bond.

Bond, who is now absent from home in the army, should not live to get home or until peace is restored to our distracted country or until his term of service expires, I direct that such portion of my estate as is herein bequeathed unto him, shall be equally divided & distributed among my three other children. As a boy, he accompanied his family in 1803 to a part of Gallatin Co., KY that would later become Owen Co., KY.

He lived in his father's household until his marriage 1 Mar 1827; Owen Co., KY marriage register .

Walker Bond and Lucy Stegar received a small legacy from her father, John Stegar, in 1830.

Walker purchased in 1833 150 acres of land on Eagle Creek in Gallatin Co. from the Rev. John Scott, the father of his sister-in-law Harriet, wife of William Bond. In fact, this land is very close to the parcel that John Scott gave to William and Harriet 10 years earlier.

Lucy died sometime between the 1850 and 1860 censes. Walker died ~15 Sep 1864, when his will was probated . His will divided his estate, consisting of 127 acres on Lick Creek, Carroll Co. (probably the same land as above), and a slave and her seven children, equally between his two children. Considering the date, a legacy of slaves had dubious value.

This is the second son of John Bond to be named John. It must be assumed that the first son had died prior to 1825 for the second son to have the same name. Like the other children of the elder John Bond and Johannah Holladay, no direct evidence (such as a will or list of children) links this man to the family, but rather a number of circumstances and bits of information indicate that he is their son. The clues are 1) John lived in Grant Co. three doors from Johannah, Warren and Allen Bond in 1850-1860 ; 2) He had land dealings in Grant Co. with Johannah Bond, Allen Bond and Rev. John Scott (who married the elder John Bond and Johannah) ; 3) John states in the 1900 census that his father and mother were born in Virginia, and that his father was a pensioner; 4) John named a son Allen A., the same name as another son of the elder John and Johannah, 5) John attested to Johannah Bond's pension application in 1853.

John was the first of the Bond clan to move to Grant Co. The move from New Liberty to western Grant Co., however, is only some 10-20 miles. He had purchased 50 acres from Rev. John Scott on 7 Mar 1846 - he was almost 21 years old - and by 1850 he was living there with a wife, Eliza and two children. The marriage record of John and Eliza has not been found, so her last name is unknown. She was born 1826/7, from her census entries.

John and Eliza remained in Grant Co., taking over his mother Johannah's 50 acres in 1857, another 40 acres from John Scott's executors in 1859, and 10 1/2 acres from his brother Allen in 1860. He remained in Grant Co through the 1870 census, then moved back to the Poplar Grove district of Owen Co. near his other family.

John married Sarah F. Stewart on 17 May 1879 in Owen Co. Sarah was born Apr 1839 in Kentucky. Her father and mother were also born in Kentucky . couldnt be him because Elizabeth is still in the 1880 census.

Name: John appears in the 1850 Census near his mother in Grant Co., p. 303 with wife Elizabeth. In the 1860, he is stil in Grant while mother moved back to Owen. In the 1880 soundex, he is John, but the regular 1880 looks like Jessie or Isper. In the 1880, his father is shown as being born in Va, which is correct for John Bond.

John received 50 Ac on Stephens Cr in Grant Co. from his mother, Johanna in 1857 (Grant Deeds H p. 16). This is land that she, in turn, received from John Scott in 1846 (Grant Co. Deeds F p. 61). Born in Gallatin Co., KY on his father's farm; assolated with the White's Run Bapist Church; enlisted in the 4th Kentucky Cavalry and brought his own horse; served until war's end; his brother gave him a fox-dog after the war, which won a silver collar as best at some point. He bought a farm Clearview, near the Kentucky and Ohio rivers in Carroll Co. KY, and I believe this is t property he is shown on in that county's landowner map of 1888. He was very active in CW reunions- a number of participation ribbons are in the possession of Kari Olson, Wauwatosa, WI (his great granddaughter). His son, William, the father of Robert, was born Sept. 9, 1793, before they came to Kentucky. He married Harriett Scott, who was born May i, 1798, the daughter

of Rev. John Scott, a Baptist minister, born in Ireland, and who married Jane Sneid. After "his marriage, William Bond located in Carroll county, took up a homestead of wild land near Ghent and died there Jan. 12, 1863. He was a soldier of the war of 1812, in Col. Dick Johnson's regiment. His wife died onlv six davs later. Thev were both members of the Baptist church and had a family of seven children : Samuel, John C., Mary J., James A., Julia F., Benjamin F. and Robert L., the last named being the only surviving- member of the family. William Bond was a Whig in his early life but later became a Democrat. Robert L. Bond has been a tiller of the soil all his life, except what time he was in the Confederate army during the war. In September, 1862, he enlisted in Company B, Fourth* Kentucky cavalry, under Capt. John G. Scott, and served until the final surrender as sergeant of his company. He was one of forty who would not surrender on Kentucky soil but surrendered at Woodstock, Ga., the latter part of May, 1865. They were permitted to retain their horses and side

arms and Mr. Bond rode home on the same horse that he furnished at the time of his enlistment, and which was with him through the entire time of his service. After the war he bought a farm in Carroll county and settled down to farming. Mr. Bond does a general farming business, his specialties being Shorthorn cattle, fine roadsters and saddle horses and fox dogs. He was one of the organizers of the American National Saddle Horse association. He is fond of fox chasing, and in 1867 won a dog collar made of Mexican silver dollars, for the best fox dog of Kentucky. He married Martha J., daughter of Richard and Priscilla (Magruder) Ramey, of Henry county, Ky., and they have a family of five children: Maynie, Margaret, Julia, James D. and Frank. Mr. and Mrs. Bond are members of the Baptist church and he is one of the best Southern Democrats in Carroll county. He is also interested in good schools and is a friend of education.

No Strangers in God's World

A Christmas Story - Natchitoches By John Merrill

Here is a Natchitoches, La., story that should be told at this Christmas-time. Not that it is unique. Perhaps not even unusual for Natchitoches, but it does illustrate that there are folks living in our midst who have the spirit of Christmas all the time.

Recently, when Operation Sagebrush [Exercise SAGE BRUSH, conducted at Fort Polk, Louisiana (Veron Parish, just south of Natchitoches Parish) in 1955-56, became the largest field trials held in the United States since World War II. It included 110.000 Army troops plus 40.000 Air Force personnel.] was in full swing and tanks, trucks and thousands of soldiers swept back and forth through this town, there were two Natchitoches ladies living besides the road who were definitely being friends to man.

Mrs. N.L. Pierce and Mrs. O.W. Spalding, who live on the the Old Mill road near the railroad switch had the opportunity to practice their Christianity and serve as "goodwill ambassadors" for Natchitoches. Most folks living on such a road at such a time would have been at least slightly annoyed as the army unloaded most of its maneuver heavy equipment right in front of their houses. But not these two. It opened a door of opportunity for them.

The sisteres put up signs showing the way to a water hydrant outside their front door and kept clean glasses on the doorsteps. They invited the boys into the yard to rest, and had picnic tables set up for them to do their paper work. The soldiers were welcome in the house to use the telephone. and to rest and wash up.

Every day the elderly ladies served coffee and cookies to all who care for refreshments - and hundreds did. Favorites were old-fashioned molasses cookies and a "whacky cake" which Mrs. Pierce makes up in the pan it's to be baked in and serves while it's hot. From reports the boys, almost without exception, asked for the recipe.

"There'll be whacky cakes all of the United States now", smiles Mrs. W.D. Roberts, who tells the story of the two unselfish ladies.

Mrs. Roberts has been lately visiting the sisters and Mrs. Spalding's husband who has been completely bedridden for two years. On one visit she showed the sisters a "Little Bible" which she had received from a friend in Pennsylvania, a tiny book containing scripture verses.

The sisters were impressed with the little books and ordered a large number of them. According to Mrs. Roberts at least 400 of them were given to soldiers who made the Pierce home their home for at least a while.

It is said more than a few of the grizzled youths that stopped in at the strange house and found true friends, went away with tears in their eyes at the kindness showed them by these complete strangers. But perhaps it is as Mrs. Pierce says: "There are no strangers in God's world." [about Margaret (Bond) Pierce and Julia (Bond) Spalding]

Russell and the other by Rev. Samuel Hoekstra.

A most unique and pretty part of the program was a little march participated in by the children of the Sunday school, of which Mr. Pierce is the superintendent. To the strains of a march played by Miss Calla Allen, the Sunday school scholars in a body marched up from the lower room each one carrying a carnation. As the procession filed past the guests of honor, the carnations were presented to Mr. and Mrs. Pierce. Agnes Miller, a little ten year old girl, represented the Sunday school and made a most appropriate little speech, saying words of greeting and good wishes to the newly married couple. Mr. Pierce responded to this speech, assuring all that their efforts put forth in weloming himself and his bride were appreciated by both.

Norval Lee Pierce, 70 years old, died at the family residence on Tuesday, May 8, 1951, at 6:00 o'clock p.m.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday afternoon at 3:00 at the First Baptist Church with the pastor, the Rev. Troy V. Wheeler, officiating. Burial was in the American Cemetery under the direction of the First National Funeral Home.

Mr. Pierce was born in Crittenden County, Ky. Dec. 31, 1871, and lived there until early manhood. He graduated at Bethel College, Ken., and then went to St. Louis, where he associated himself with the General Roofing Manufacturing Company. Earning advancement, he was made manager of the company's plant at Marsailles, Ill., which position he held for a number of years. While there he married Miss Margaret Bond of New Orleans, a native of Kentucky.

Later, his employers merged their company with others and was known as the Certainteed Products Company. Mr. Pierce was placed as credit manager of the Chicago office, which position he held for ten years.

In 1933, Mr. and Mrs. Pierce and their son, James Pierce, came to Natchitoches to make their home. A son, Norval Lee Pierce, Jr., died in Chicago in 1931 at the age of 17. James Pierce, World War II veteran, married Miss Helene Vandell [Vaubel]. They are the parents of two children. He is an accountant for the Firestone Tire and Rubber Company in St. Louis, where they live. All are members of the Third Baptist Church.

Other survivors besides his wife, son and two grandchildren, are a sister, Mrs. Mirian [Miriam] Pierce Dobyns of Hazzard, Ky., four nephews and one niece. Other brothers and sisters preceded him in death.

Since living here, Mr. Pierce has farmed and was interested in the advancement of farming, having owned at one time a plantation in Mississippi.

Mr. Pierce became a Christian early in life and faithfully served as Sunday School superintendent, teacher and deacon at the First Baptist Church. He was a membed [member] of the the Masonic Lodge.

Norval seems to have had a somewhat checkered career. At the time of his marriage, he was the resident manager of a roofing company large enough that when employees chipped in for a wedding

gift, it was a chest of solid silver (eating utensils that Kari Pierce has). However, by 1918 (when James was born), they were living on the "plantation", which looks like a pretty poor looking farm in Woodville Mississippi. In 1920, they were on a farm in Tupelo, MS that had a rather grand two-story Victorian style house. By 1930, Norval had a job with the Certainteed Co. (insulation & roofing) and they owned a house in Chicago valued at \$15,000, with a live-in cook/servant, and in the census, he listed his occupation as "salesman of real estate and insurance". In 1932 (winter of 33), they moved to a farm in Natchitoches. That farm may have been, or been nearby, "Frankelva", the farm owned by Margaret's brother Frank and his wife Elva. Since N.L. was 61 at the time, they may have essentially retired back to farm life, or may have been victims of the depression, with Frank and Elva allowing them to live there.

James was known during his lifetime as James Frank, but was born James Robert. At the age of 14, he started using the middle name Frank, the name of his uncle instead of Robert, the name of his grandfather, who had died by the time he was born. When he was drafted, 3 Dec 1943, his parents made an affadavit so James Frank would be on his service record.

He grew up on the Pierce's farm in Woodville, played basketball as a youth. He went to 2 yr business college at Chilicothe, OH (probably Southeastern Business College, now Samuel Stephen College) and there met Helene Vaubel. They married after graduation. During WWII he was stationed in the States as an acountant. After the war, the family lived in Memphis, TN and St. Louis, MO. They then moved to Milwaukee, WI in 1952 where he worked as an accountant and eventually office manager for the Firestone Tire & Rubber Co.

In 1965, after more than 20 years wth Firestone, he quit and became a purchasing agent for Kickhaefer Mfg. Co. of Grafton, WI, a manufacturer of clamps and fittings. FOND MEMORIES OF THE FARM

My first recollection must have been around the time when I was three or four years old and I realized I had a Mom and Dad, three brothers and many, many cats - - all sizes everywhere. Most of the cats, tho, stayed close to the barn where they hunted for mice and waited for fresh milk every morning and evening.

Our house was a white, two story with a front porch and a privy in back near a grove of trees. There was a nice grove on the west and also on the north side of the farm which made a wind break against the winter winds. Our home was in Benton County which was four and a half miles northeast of Dysart, Iowa.

Mom was a neat and tidy homemaker and a good Mother. Dad was a quiet, gentle man. Both were up early every morning, Mother starting breakfast and Dad doing the chores. Both were ambitious and hard workers, as were most farm people.

Ellis was my oldest brother and Dean was fifteen months younger. They were always very active and full of "beans". Never a dull moment as they could always think of something to do. When they weren't helping Dad, they were usually in the tool shed putting some darn thing together with wheels or pedals so they could ride down the road. Rex was the youngest and often followed behind the older boys. He was quiet and amiable like our Father.

The wide assortment of cats and kittens seemed to be an important part of my life before I went to school. A black and white male, which was naturally called "Tom" was very lovable and on occasion was allowed in the house. I had fun dressing him in doll clothes and would take him for a ride in my doll buggy. He seemed to love it and never moved a hair until I was through playing with him. Tom lived a long life and then one day just disappeared.

Lots of things happened every day on the farm, especially in summer, Threshing time was always exciting and we would look and look for the big steam engine to come up the road to our place. Farmers around the area helped each other so we always knew it would mean around fifteen men or more for dinner. Mom and I worked for days planning dinners and sometimes, if we had larger fields of oats, it could take several days to finish the threshing.

I remember my love for baby mice that were found in the corn shed and I would put them in a cotton lined match box. Much to my Mother's embarrassment, I'd bring out my box of mice and show the threshers while they were eating their dinner. They didn't seem to mind, tho. Dean always worked along with the men and every year we knew he would get sick sooner or later, either because he worked so hard or maybe he would overeat - We never knew which.

I seem to remember more about Dean than my other two brothers, probably because he teased me so much. Some times, I would go to my room and cry. Maybe I was over sensitive but to this day, I don't care to be teased.

One time, Dean talked me into climbing up to a tree house he and Ellis had built and then I didn't know how to get down. A darn bee stung me on my head and I was a mess before Dean offered to help me. I'd always heard that most brothers were mean and ornery and I sure thought so that day! One day, Dean and Ellis looked at their old bicycle which they shared and wondered what they could do with the tire which wouldn't hold air. Dean thought he had a bright idea and went after a pail of oats. Somehow, the two of them stuffed oats in the tire though a large hole, then put a tire patch over it. They tried to ride the bike but it didn't work too well. The rest of us had a good time laughing about it tho.

Summer days in lowa meant very hot days, many violent thunder storms and sometimes the threat of a tornado which would have us flying down to the basement. Mother and Dad were very strict about having us come to the house if there was even a hint of a storm brewing and we always did. Other days were beautiful and sometimes Mom would take us fishing in the afternoon or would make lemonade and we'd sit in the shade and relax before starting the evening chores. Dad always joined us if he had time but usually we'd drive through the field and take refreshments to him. When the boys were older, they would work along with him. By the time I was fourteen, I was allowed to take the car

alone and drive to wherever they were working. In Iowa we could get a driver's license at age fourteen. Now, I think sixteen is a little too young!

Sundays were quiet and we always went to the Methodist Church in

Dysart, then home to a big dinner which had been previously prepared and put in the oven, then a trip to the Grandparents

One Sunday at Grandpa and Grandma Vaubel's in Dysart and the following Sunday at Grandpa and Grandma Shafer's on their farm near Garrison. There was quite a difference in personalities. Grandpa Vaubel always met us at the door in his usual jovial manner and very German accent saying, "Mell, ya wanna play some rummey?" Grandpa Shafer always had a baseball game on the radio and we had to sit quietly until it was over. After that, however, he would smile and take us out to a shed where he would show us all the beakers, chemicals, vials etc. and talk to us about his latest invention. We would stand there in awe thinking he was the smartest Grandpa around and he did manage to obtain a few patents. One I remember was called "Solderene". Guess it was some type of formula to be used with solder to bind things together. -

Mother and Dad were early risers as were most farm people. Bedtime, then was around 8:00 P.M. and that included all of us! We really didn't mind too much as we all had our chores, homework and it was a full day. Sometimes, if we weren't quite ready for sleep, one of us would start telling a story. Ellis and Dean had a double bed in the south bedroom, Rex was in the north room and mine in the southeast with short halls connecting. It was easy to hear the storyteller and when one got tired, he would pass it on to another until finally we all drifted off to sleep. Dean, as usual, came out with some outrageous tales and in those days, we had vivid imaginations and had some weird nightmares. Maxine Vaubel, my first cousin, and I were very close friends. She lived a mile away and we often met halfway on our bikes, then we'd go to her house or mine. We loved the usual things like dolls but also were fascinated by tap dancing. We never had any lessons but spent hours working on the steps we would see in the days when there was always a chorus line or vaudeville act between the movie and Pathe news. We never learned the steps too well but had a lot of fun trying.

I think it must have been the 30's when my Dad, his brother, Earl, and a step-brother-in-law, Blakely thought they were real sports with their new automobiles. I clearly remember them racing up and down the dirt road in front of our house. Earl had an Essex, Blakely, a Hudson Super- Six" and Dad, a Maxwell. They laughed a lot and had loads of fun. My brothers were very envious but I thought they were just plain foolish for their age.

One summer, Dean and Ellis ordered a root beer kit from Sears & Roebuck. We checked the mail every day and finally it came. I can't remember the ingredients we had to add but Mom insisted that we do the whole process on a table in the back yard. We all took part in the mixing and bottling, then waited patiently for several weeks for it to "work". We thought it was magnificent but I'm sure it wasn't all that great but we drank it anyway.

We went to school at Dysart Consolidated which meant being picked up by a school bus. There were times when we never made it due to heavy snow and then the teachers were very patient and spent extra time with us so that we could make up the work we had missed.

When Ellis and Dean were old enough to drive, fourteen then, they obtained an old Model T. Ford. I'm not sure where, but they thought it needed a coat of paint among other things. That meant another order to Sears Roebuck for a few cans of maroon paint. The paint arrived and it was a bright red but that didn't bother them at all. Rex and I were allowed to help them paint and it was time to show it off. NOW they had a way to get to school without riding the bus. We would wait until the bus had picked up the last kid and on it's way, then we would come roaring up behind the bus, honking and waving as we went around. One day, just as we had passed the bus, a wheel flew off and rolled into the ditch. We came to a sudden stop. The bus driver and all the kids hooted and hollered and nearly cried as we had to get on the bus after all. All four of us were embarrassed, even Dean. School was something we had to attend. We never objected or questioned it like the kids of today. I can't say that I ever enjoyed school very much but I did study enough to graduate in the "Super Six", as it was called. Don't think the school system today would go for that title or be allowed to. There weren't many, if any, dropouts in those days but I thought all the boys in the class were plain dumb. I've learned since that many went on to college and obtained important jobs, so I guess I could have been wrong.

After graduating, I went to Chillecothe Business College, graduated and went to St. Louis and worked

for Metropolitan Life Ins. Co. Ellis and Rex went to Iowa University and became Doctors. Dean enjoyed the farm life and still loves it. Many years have passed since the days on the farm - work, marriage, a family and an entirely
